What data provides evidence of current growth stage?

Based on data from the 2014-2015 Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO) State Report, West Pine Middle met 13 out of 14 targets in reading. Proficiency increased for total students in 2014-2015 but many subgroups have considerable gaps between the state-required 2015-2016 AMO target and the current level of proficiency as follows:

Amer.Indian:10.3, Black: 19.5, ED: 10.7, SWD: 12.4. West Pine Middle had mixed results of the expected growth requirement as indicated by EVAAS data specifically in 8th grade -2.9; 7th grade -0.2 and 6th grade met growth with 1.6 points.

Annual Objective:

Using targeted interventions, West Pine Middle School will increase reading proficiency for Black students by 19.5%, American Indian students by 10.3%, Economically Disadvantaged students by 10.7%, and Students with Disabilities by 12.4% and maintain expected growth for all other student subgroups in order to meet or exceed AMO targets and decrease the achievement gap for the 2015-2016 school year.

Mid Year Target:

By implementing our action steps and strategies, students will increase their Lexile levels by at least 50 points using the Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI) mid year assessment in February. English Language Arts interim assessments data points are monitored to assess growth. English Language Arts teachers and the Reading Plus teacher will meet monthly to design differentiated instruction. Personal Education Plans are in place for at-risk students. Flex time will be implemented with fidelity as teachers meet with identified students. First time implementation of our data wall by teachers in October 2015 and quarterly progress check in January 2016.

What data provides evidence of current growth stage?

Based on data from AMO Targets and State Targets from the 2014-2015 school year, West Pine Middle met 11 out of 14 targets in math. Proficiency in math was achieved by total students in 2014-2015 but many subgroups have considerable gaps between the state-required 2015-2016 AMO target and the 2014-2015 level of proficiency as follows: Black: 27.3, Hispanic: 14, ED: 18.2, SWD: 26.1. West Pine Middle did not meet the expected growth requirement in math as indicated by EVAAS data specifically in 8th grade -3.1; 7th grade -1.1, 6th grade -0.3 points.

Annual Objective:

Using targeted interventions and strategies listed below, West Pine Middle School will increase math proficiency for students in the following subgroups: Black: 27.3, Hispanic: 14, ED: 18.2, SWD: 26.1 and maintain expected growth for all other student subgroups The increases will meet or exceed AMO targets and decrease the achievement gap for the 2015-2016 school year.

Mid Year Target:

Students will demonstrate mastery of the math curriculum as indicated on the district pacing guide. Benchmark tests, common assessments and online tracking websites will be used to measure proficiency and growth of student mastery. Personal Education Plans are in place for at-risk students. Flex time will be implemented with fidelity as teachers meet with identified students. First time implementation of our data wall by teachers in October 2015 and quarterly progress check in January 2016.

Qualitative conversations during 2014-2015 with various groups of the school community expressed concern over communication and collaboration within the school.
